Directions:

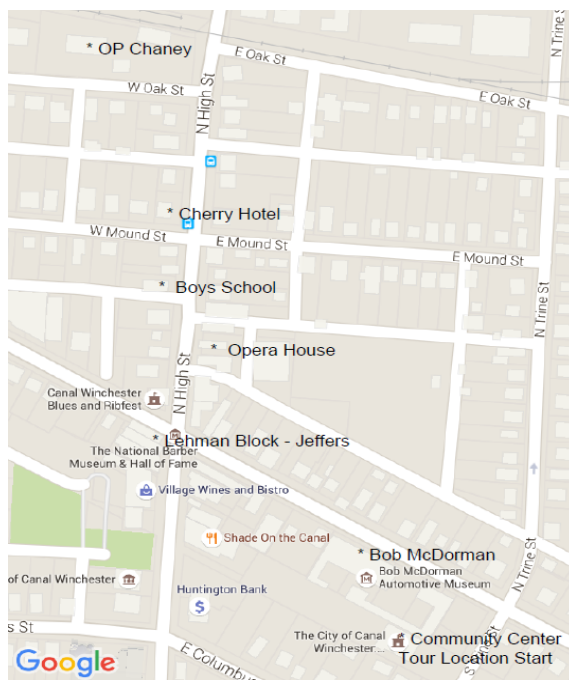
From Columbus:

Turn Right onto North High Street
Turn left on East Waterloo and
Turn Right on South Trine Street

From Lancaster:

US-33 W towards Columbus
Take the HILL ROAD/DILEY RD Exit/
CR 18
CR-18 becomes East Waterloo Street
Turn left onto South Trine Street

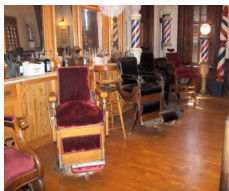
The first group will begin the tour at 7:00 p.m., and the last group will depart no later than 7:30 p.m. each evening. The tour will take approximately 90 minutes.

Bob McDorman-1



The Bob McDorman Museum sits on the site of the old Lumber Mill that was built along the canal in 1857. It was owned by George Bareis a prominent citizen, businessman and historian.

Ed Jeffers-2



The Ed Jeffers Barber Museum, with barber

shop, opened in 1988 featuring the barbering memorabilia of Ed Jeffers. It is the only museum exclusively devoted to the profession of barbering.

Games Opera House-3



The Opera House was located on the 2nd floor of the commercial building built by the Game

brothers in 1871. It was the cultural center of the village. It burned in 1922 due to an explosion in the store below.

The Boys School-4



The brick house was built in 1848 on land donated by John Kramer.

In 1855 it housed the "advanced" students. In the early 1850's it was the "boys' school." The building was sold when the school on Washington St. opened in 1862.

Cherry Hotel-5



Isaac Ebright built the Freeman Hotel c 1871. It was purchased by Noah Cherry, the 5th owner,

in 1896. An ice cream parlor, restaurant and pool room operated in conjunction with the hotel. Mr. Cherry had a livery station in the rear.

OP Chaney Elevator- 6



O. P. Chaney built a grain elevator along the railroad tracks after his downtown elevator burned in 1878. The Chaney Elevator is the

second elevator on the site - after another fire destroyed the first in 1880. The Elevator, at 50 feet high, is the tallest building in Canal Winchester.
